

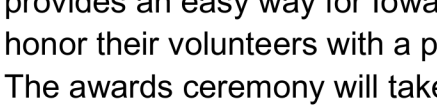

Volunteer Iowa's Response in Greenfield

Volunteer Iowa staff have been on the ground supporting the community of Greenfield, IA after the deadly EF-4 tornado hit on Tuesday, May 21. As part of our partnership with Homeland Security and Emergency Management and Iowa HHS, we have been tasked with the coordination of spontaneous volunteers, supporting food and donated goods distribution, and helping those affected get connected to help with debris removal and sorting, assist with removing large trees, and a variety of other activities.

Since the Volunteer Reception Center was established on May 24, we have organized nearly 1300 volunteers who showed up to get to work helping those impacted the most. During this phase, we will continue to support the community with the spontaneous volunteer management support. The Volunteer Reception Center is located at 801 NE 6th Street, Greenfield, located in the Cardinal Glass parking lot. All volunteers are required to check in. Large groups should call 515-561-3744 at least a day prior to arriving.

More than 600 awards are being presented during this year's ceremony. It is estimated that more than 150 communities in Iowa were served by this year's honorees.

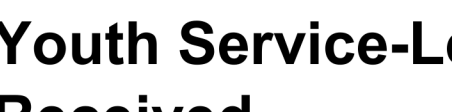

Volunteer Iowa Awards \$8.9 Million for State AmeriCorps Programs

Volunteer Iowa has awarded \$8.9 million in grant funding and an additional \$2.4 million in Segal AmeriCorps Education Awards for Iowa AmeriCorps State programs and members. These grants will support 19 programs engaging more than 750 AmeriCorps members in Iowa who will serve with nonprofit, community and faith-based organizations across the state. Five additional grantees will conduct planning activities to develop and expand new AmeriCorps programming across the state.

Programs across the state are currently recruiting AmeriCorps members to serve in the coming year. Iowa AmeriCorps members may be eligible to receive benefits including a living allowance, health care, childcare, and the Segal AmeriCorps Education Award. 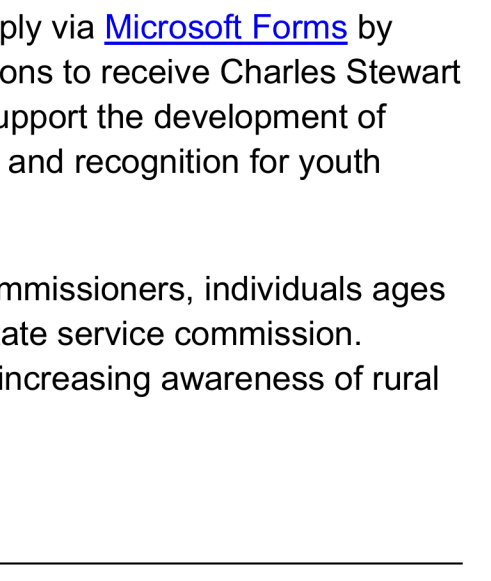
Youth Mental Health Corps

We are thrilled to announce the launch of the Youth Mental Health Corps in our state! With this innovative and youth-led solution, our state will be able to address the barriers many young people face when accessing mental health care while at the same time creating pathways to careers in the behavioral health workforce. This new program was created by Pinterest and the Schultz Family Foundation in partnership with AmeriCorps, to create on-ramps to behavioral health careers for young people across the country.

Youth Service-Learning Funding Received

Volunteer Iowa has received funding from The Allstate Foundation and America's Service Commissions (ASC) to expand youth-led service initiatives. Iowa was one of 10 state service commissions selected to receive The Allstate Foundation Empowering Youth Service Grant. Through this opportunity, youth-serving organizations may apply for \$2,500 in funding to



support service-learning development. Interested applicants may apply via [Microsoft Forms](#) by June 14th. Volunteer Iowa was also one of 8 state service commissions to receive Charles Stewart Mott Foundation's Deepening Youth Service Grant. This grant will support the development of tiered service-learning trainings, resources to support youth service, and recognition for youth volunteers.

In addition, ASC is making \$1,500 mini-grants available to Youth Commissioners, individuals ages 16-25 serving as a youth representative on a governor designated state service commission. Madison Craig, a Volunteer Iowa commissioner, is leading a project increasing awareness of rural health disparities.

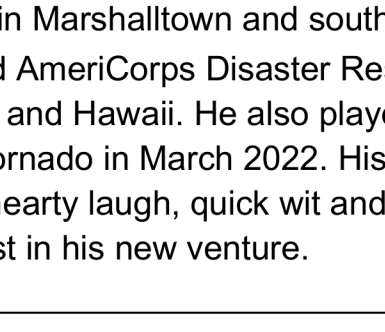
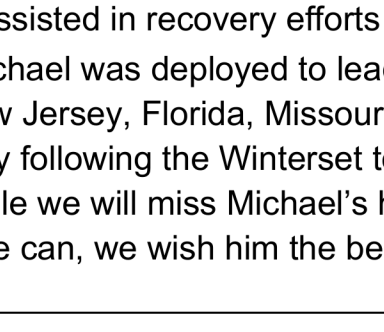
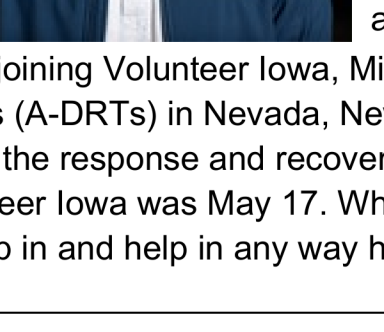
Honoring our Outgoing Commissioners

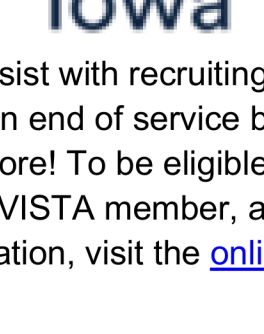
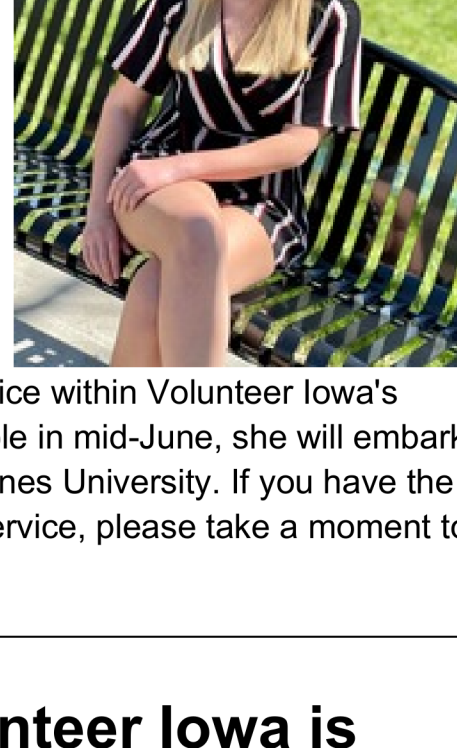
