
Volunteer Iowa's Response in Greenfield Volunteer Iowa staff have been on the ground supporting the community of Greenfield, IA after the

deadly ESF-4 tornado hit on Tuesday, May 21. As part of our partnership with Homeland Security and Emergency Management and Iowa HHS, we have been tasked with the coordination of spontaneous volunteers, supporting food and donated goods distribution, and helping those affected get connected to help with debris removal and sorting, assist with removing large trees, and a variety

of other activities. Since the Volunteer Reception Center was established on May 24, we have organized nearly 1300 volunteers who showed up to get to work helping those impacted the most. During this phase, we will continue to support the community with the spontaneous volunteer management support. The Volunteer Reception Center is located at 801 NE 6th Street, Greenfield, located in the Cardinal






